Please staff and students wish to welcome Allicia Westad to our school. Miss Westad is in her third year of study and presently doing her student teaching in the grade 7 & 8 classroom under the supervision of Mr. Mumert.

Yes, there are now confirmed cases of H1N1 in the school community (students and parents). We are continuing with encouraging regular hand washing, proper coughing techniques, and using hand sanitizer after blowing the nose, etc. The staff continues to **stress proper hygiene** so as to reduce the spread of virus and bacteria particles. The custodian is taking care to wipe down regularly touched surfaces so as to remove or kill virus and bacteria particles. We will continue to phone for pick up any student that becomes ill while at school. Reminder, if your child is ill; **please** keep them at home until they are well and able to resume regular activities. Water bottles are frequently not being taken home at the end of the day. Please see the attached document regarding cleaning water bottles properly and assist the staff with stressing to the students the need to take water bottles home for **a proper cleaning** each day. Halloween activities will take place this week. The kindergarten is doing a mini theme this week with 'spooky foods', etc and costumes on Thursday. **Friday is a theme** day for the students. Students are encouraged to dress for Halloween activities, keeping in mind that we will have regular classes for most of the day. **Be creative** with your costumes, no weapons or gore please. The older grades will be hosting **game centers** in the gym from **2:15pm to 3:20pm** for the grades 1 to 6. Students will be grouped into teams, so if you are expecting to not attend, please send a note in your child's agenda so we do not put them on a team. Thank you☺

Charter Board Highlights Oct. 2009

We are a little more than one month into the school year and now have our official September 30 count of 93 full-time equivalent students. This puts us very close to the Minister of Education's expectation that we reach an enrolment of 100 students as soon as possible. It is a great pleasure to have all of these students here, ready for learning. In order to respond to the educational needs of this healthy student population, the Charter Board passed a motion at the October meeting to add two half-time teacher assistants to support the grade 3 /4 and 5/6 classes in the morning. It was also noted, any further registrations will be carefully assessed by Superintendent Freddi Bromling for their educational impacts before new students would be accepted. In addition, knowing that we will continue to grow as we expand into grade nine next September, and will, therefore, need access to the classroom that now houses the Valhalla Community Library, plans continue to add extra space.

Meanwhile, thank you to our staff for their hard work and dedication to the vision of our school. Our Charter Board has been given the mandate to deliver an innovative program grounded in whole-group direct instruction and incorporating mandatory second language and student leadership development. These people are the ones on the front lines that have been given the challenge of doing what needs to be done to carry out these charter goals. We truly appreciate their energy and effort in this venture.
