We have a regularly scheduled early dismissal day the first Monday of each month. (We apologize that we missed printing this in last week's newsletter)

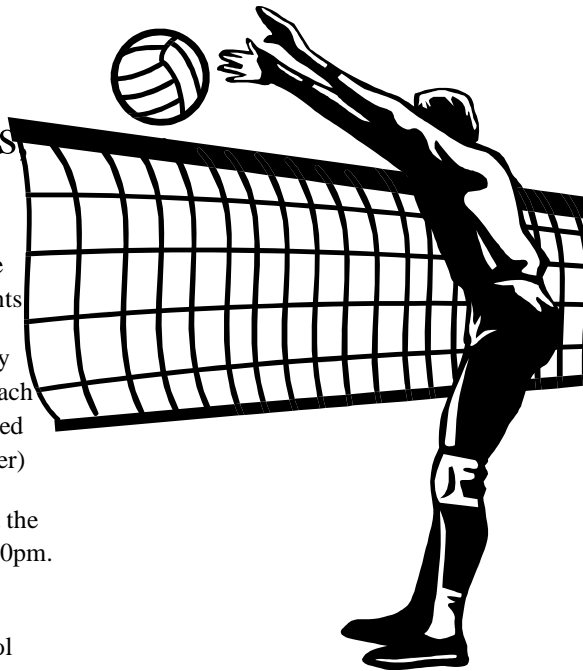
Student assemblies are usually held the first Tuesday of each month at 12:40pm. Visitors are welcome to attend.
